### **Acknowledging the Land**

The Foundation For Black Communities is currently on the land of Indigenous communities who have been stewards of these lands since time immemorial and who continue to be systematically erased by policies and practices that remove their histories from this place.

We also acknowledge board and staff members of African descent whose ancestors were forcibly displaced as part of the transatlantic slave trade, brought against their will, and made to work on these lands. We believe that advancing Indigenous sovereignty and Black liberation are deeply and inextricably linked to one another and we remain committed to advancing both.







Black communities have been calling for a new approach to philanthropy. The Foundation for Black Communities (FFBC) was established to fulfill this call and to ensure all Black people and communities can thrive and have agency in defining their own futures.

Founded in 2020 with a mission to transform communities, FFBC is Canada's philanthropic foundation dedicated to ensuring that Black-led, Black-serving, and Black-focused organizations have the sustained resources needed to make meaningful impact.

# Our Approach

### Vision

A future where Black communities in Canada have the resources, organizations, and influence necessary to shape their own solution making and self-determination.

### Mission

We invest in change-making, working alongside Canadian community, philanthropic, political, and business organizations to ensure that Black-led, Black-serving, and Black-focused non-profit, charitable, and grassroots organizations have the sustained resources and infrastructures they need to make a meaningful impact.

### **Participatory Funding Approach**

Based on the idea that we are **interconnected**, and we can improve the conditions for ourselves by **improving the conditions** for those around us.

It places significant emphasis on the knowledge, creativity, experiences, and ideas of those that are closest to the desired outcome of the programming.

It places trust, justice and agency at the centre of its philosophy, and FFBC uses this approach to disrupt and democratize philanthropy.

# **Available Funding**

### Core

Eligible organizations and groups can apply for up to \$40,000

This stream will fund core activities related to the operational success of the organization or group.

Applicants can submit proposals for staffing, non-staffing, and administrative costs unrelated to programming.







## Catapult

Eligible organizations and groups can apply for \$40,000 to \$100,000 to explore new or existing approaches to improving socio-economic wellbeing in Black communities, including the research, design, piloting, and evaluation of initiatives.

**New ideas and approaches:** Organizations building or launching new programs or services, testing new approaches, or exploring and experimenting may apply for \$40,000 - \$75,000.

Expanding programs or services: Organizations that plan to grow or sustain existing programs or services may apply for \$40,000 - \$100,000. Organizations must demonstrate the existing program or service.







# **Community Capital**

Eligible organizations and groups with bold and big ideas that advance the social and economic infrastructure of Black communities.

Organizations can apply for up to \$250,000 to scale programs, services or commercialization initiatives.

Funding is intended to invest in anchor organizations or potential anchor organizations – that are indispensable to their sector or /community, contribute to a stronger ecosystem for Black communities, and lay the groundwork for transformative change.









# Eligibility



# Who is Eligible?



Be Black-led, Black-focused, and Black-serving (B3) organizations, groups, and collaboratives.

This means that the majority of organizational leadership at all levels are Black. The organization's primary goal is to meaningfully support and engage Black communities, and a significant portion of program activities prioritize serving Black communities.



Be a registered charity, incorporated non-profit, other qualified donee or an unincorporated non-profit or group working with an incorporated partner.

Unincorporated groups could include Black collaboratives, Student Unions, Affinity Groups, etc.



Be located in Canada.

Proposed activities must be based in Canada.









### Ineligible Organizations/Groups



- Organizations that are not Black-led, Black-focused, and Black-serving;
- For-profit organizations or corporations;
- Individuals;
- Business institutions, including business associations, chambers of commerce and condominium associations;
- Provincial/territorial entities, including hospitals, medical centres, schools, private schools, universities, colleges, health authorities, public health authorities, educational institutions, and health/social services institutions;
- Municipalities and entities controlled by a municipality, including municipal governments, regional governments, and regional districts, and;
- Organizations primarily engaged in political activity supporting or opposing any political party, elected representative, or candidate for public office.



### Black Ideas Grant: Bridge and Build 2023

The Foundation for Black Communities's Black Ideas Grant: Bridge and Build 2023 is a significant investment of \$8.9 million to acknowledge and support solution-oriented initiatives led by Canada's Black communities. This pilot program will fund some of the immediate and direct needs of Black communities and give valuable insights for future funding programs.

The Bridge and Build Fund provides one-year flexible funding to increase the capacity of Black-led, Black-focused, and Black-serving charitable and non-profit organizations and groups as they combat anti-Black racism and improve social and economic outcomes for Black communities.

Applications open on December 18, 2023, and must be submitted by February 1, 2024, at 11:59 PM PT.

We strongly recommend that you read the guidelines before beginning the application process. You can find the guidelines, FAQs and other helpful documents here.

The application will be available in other formats on the website, and we suggest you draft your responses and collect all attachments before entering your application on the portal. You can save and review your responses before submitting your application.

La Subvention pour accélérer les grandes idées des communautés noires 2023 : connexion et croissance (Subvention connexion et croissance) de la FPCN représente un investissement important de 8,9 millions de dollars pour reconnaître et soutenir des initiatives axées sur des solutions et dirigées par des communautés noires au Canada. 
















### **Oral Application Process**

### **Selection Process**

### **Selection Criteria**



Addresses one or more of the Sustainable <u>Development Goals</u> and Social Determinants of Health

Addresses at least one of the three Focus Areas

- Combatting Anti-Black Racism
- Improving Social Outcomes
- Improving Economic **Outcomes**

Ensures the initiative can be implemented in the proposed timeline and with the available funding

Has a positive outcome for Black communities in Canada

Does not include any of the ineligible activities









### **Community Selection Circles**

All FFBC Funding decisions are made by Community Selection Circles, composed of 50% applicants and 50% wider community members. For the Foundation for Black Communities to be successful, we need the voice, and expertise of all Black communities.

The importance of community is why FFBC adopts the Participatory Grant making approach which is based on the idea that we are interconnected, and we can improve the conditions for ourselves by improving the conditions for those around us.


It places significant emphasis on the knowledge, creativity, experiences, and ideas of those that are closest to the desired outcome of the programming.

Community Selection Circles will recommend applicants for consideration by the board.









# Join the Community Selection Circles

All eligible applicants have the chance to join the Community Selection Circles.

You can nominate yourself or another person through this link:

<u>Community Selection Circles - The Foundation for Black Communities Survey (surveymonkey.com)</u>

Community Selection Circles will receive applications in early February and will have 3 weeks to read, select and score applications from their local regions.

Community Selection Circles will also be invited to attend a selection meeting where they will be presented with the overall granting strategy, have the opportunity to share feedback, and identify learnings.

**Honoraria:** Members will be paid hourly at a rate of \$22.50 CAD for, up to a max . total rate of \$450, and up to a maximum of 20 hours.


# Reporting

### **Verbal Update**
