B.I.G. Black Ideas Grant: Bridge and Build 2023

FFBC's Black Ideas Grant: Bridge and Build 2023 is a significant investment of \$8.9 million to acknowledge and support solutionoriented initiatives led by Canada's Black communities. This inaugural program will fund some of the immediate and direct needs of Black communities and give valuable insights for future funding programs.

Important Dates and Deadlines

- Applications open: December 18, 2023
 - All applicants will receive notification of the outcome of their application in March 2024. Applicants are invited to apply to three streams.
- Deadline to apply: February 1, 2024

Eligibility

- Be Black-led, Black-focused, and Black-serving (B3) organizations, groups, and collaboratives.
 - Majority of organizational leadership at all levels are Black. The organization's primary goal is to meaningfully support and engage Black communities, and a significant portion of program activities prioritize serving Black communities.
- Be a registered charity, incorporated non-profit, other qualified donee or an unincorporated non-profit or group working with an incorporated partner.
 - Unincorporated groups could include Black collaboratives, Student Unions, Affinity Groups, etc.

Be located in Canada.

• Proposed activities must be based in Canada.



About the Grant

Applicants are invited to apply to three streams:

- The Core stream
- Catapult stream
- Community Capital stream







• Core

- Eligible organizations and groups can apply for up to \$40,000 to address core funding needs.
- This stream will fund core activities related to the operational success of the organization or group.



Applicants can submit proposals for staffing, non-staffing, and administrative costs unrelated to programming.



Catapult

Eligible organizations and groups can apply for \$40,000 to \$100,000 to explore new or existing approaches to improving socio-economic well-being in Black communities, including the research, design, piloting, and evaluation of initiatives.

• New ideas and approaches: \$40,000 - \$75,000.





Community Capital

- Bold and big ideas that advance the social and economic infrastructure of Black communities
- Up to \$250,000 to scale programs, services, or commercialization initiatives
- Contribute to a stronger ecosystem for Black communities and lay the groundwork for transformative change

Community Selection Circles

- All FFBC Funding decisions are made by Community Selection Circles, composed of 50% applicants and 50% wider community members.
- Community Selection Circles will recommend applicants for consideration by the board
- Community Selection Circles will attend a selection meeting and be presented with the overall granting strategy, share feedback, and identify learnings.


